

Abstract for Conceptions of Islam

Christine M. Jacobsen is a social anthropologist and has been working in the field of International Migration and Ethnic Relations with a focus on Muslim minorities in Europe. In particular she has been concerned with changes that affect religious identities and practices among young people and women in a context of international migration. Theoretically, Jacobsen has worked with anthropological approaches to Islam as a discursive tradition and with developing theoretical and analytical tools for dealing with “tradition” and “agency”. She has also been concerned with theorizing multiculturalism, in particular in relation to feminist theory. Jacobsen is now a researcher at the Stein Rokkan Centre for Social Sciences and works on the issue of transnationalism from the point of view of two different ethnographic fields: transnational prostitution as a form of female migration, and political mobilisation and engagement in transnational networks among young adults of immigrant background.
